What is Advocacy?



- Advocacy means acting to effect change
 - Advocates organize themselves to take steps to redress issues that negatively affect their community
 - Advocates act on behalf of their community and/or support their community to act on their own behalf
 - Advocacy has been described as "speaking truth to power"

Advocacy – From Initiation to Completion



- Advocacy is a process:
 - 1) Identify, validate and prioritize the issues
 - 2) Research and rationalize the benefit of redressing the issues
 - 3) Develop viable solutions that redress the issue and achieve the intended benefit
 - 4) Develop an advocacy strategy and execute it
 - 5) Evaluate whether the intended benefit is being achieved
 - 6) If the benefit is **not** being achieved, repeat steps 3, 4 and 5

Principles of an Advocacy Strategy



- Not all advocacy initiatives target governments, but most do in tourism given its nature and the issues we face
- An advocacy strategy typically needs to:
 - draw links to government priorities where possible
 - be framed as benefitting public interest
 - adopt a multi-partisan approach

Advocacy Strategy Tactics



- Most advocacy strategies include:
 - correspondence, submission of proposals and meetings with key departmental officials
 - same as above but with elected decision-makers with an emphasis on Cabinet ministers
 - creating and mobilizing coalitions
 - hosting policy/advocacy events and forums
 - launching grassroots campaigns
 - Influencing public opinion via national, local, trade and social media

Why Advocacy Matters



- It is how to influence policy to effect change that benefits a community
- In tourism, we know there is an issue to attract and retain an adequate labour force
- We can't fully rebuild without an adequate pool of labour
- Advocacy will be required federally and in the provinces and territories to effect change to programs like TFW, Immigration streams, EI-funded programs and introduce new initiatives
